Dear Friends

Sometimes life is difficult - things don't work out as they 'should', and we get confused; where is God in it all?

I confess that I gave up trying to second guess God a long time ago. And recently I've been captivated by a book called *Faith of our Father* by Dale Ralph Davis; it's about Abraham, who had more reason than most to be confused by his Creator. God promised him a son and heir with Sarah when he was in his eighties and did so again when he was not far off 100 - but promised that it would be 'within the year', this time. Sarah, his wife, laughed, not surprisingly; God said 'why are you laughing?' and she fibs 'I wasn't' (but she jolly well was) - and God says, well, when your son arrives, you call him Isaac (it means laughter). I love the humour!

But through this delayed fulfilment of God's promise, and other really difficult situations, Abraham learns to trust God. I believe God teaches us the same way, if we will just see lived Christian faith as a pilgrimage, a learning experience with God, no less. Sometimes we think, God and me, we can do this; no - *God* can do it, and we must just stick close to Him, especially through confusing times.

Two small encouragements. The first is a story I came across recently about a little boy who went to bed and shortly afterwards fell out. His Mum went to him and comforted him and asked what happened. Said he, 'I fell out of bed because I stayed too near where I got in'. Well, that can happen with our faith too. If we don't develop it by walking with Jesus, we can drift away from it; indeed, fall from it - but that would be a great loss to us.

The second is some lovely words from Psalm 131, and I finish with them:

O Lord, my heart is not proud, nor my eyes raised too high; I do not occupy myself with things too great, too difficult for me. But I have calmed and quieted my soul.

May our souls be like that; calmed, quieted, consoled, healed as we draw close to our Lord. I pray that especially for those who I know are experiencing trials, confusion and griefs.

Do come along for an hour of quiet contemplation.


