#### Dear Friends

A few weeks ago, I perhaps rashly enrolled for a diocesan book club, to discuss a modest tome with the engaging (?) title 'Christian Apologetics: an Introduction.' It's written by Alister McGrath, an erstwhile college friend of mine with a doctorate coming out of both ears - one scientific, one theological. Like most of my erstwhile college friends, he went on to much bigger things than I. I never really understood him, in truth, but I have since appreciated that it's because he is intelligent, and so can make the simple complex. (Not fair! - he perceives complexity through the facade of simplicity).

So why are you reading this book, you ask? Good question! Actually, I'm enjoying it. Let me share just one little observation from it... What do we mean by Christian faith? Well - to most people outside Christianity, faith is 'merely some kind of belief, or intellectual assent', and it's founded on some reasonable collation of evidence (historical, philosophical, cosmological etc). To believe in God to this degree is to believe that God exists. But, as McGrath points out: 'recent scholarship suggests that ... 'faith' in the cultural world of the New Testament is best described as 'relational trust'. So, the Apostles Creed starts with the Latin word credo, and credo means to trust or confide in a person or thing; to have confidence in.' I believe in God...

So Christian faith embraces both an intellectual judgment, and a credo, a personal commitment to (and trust of) God, as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And when we get to that point the adventure begins - as we learn to want God's way in our lives, to trust Him more than we trust ourselves and, amazingly, to build a relationship - with God! It is extraordinary, but it's what He created us for; just as Adam and Eve walked with Him before they decided they knew better, and just as the disciples walked with Him even after the resurrection - so we are made to walk with God.

Simplify that, you might say. Well: walk through life one day at a time in conversation with Jesus, listening, loving, obeying. Never mind the circumstances; just keep your eyes on Jesus. He says 'take my yoke upon you', and 'go MY way and I'll work it all out for good.' It takes practice, but truly it's how to live out Christian faith. It goes very deep. Me? Well, I've still got my L-plates! - but I'm journeying. And church is where we journey together, sharing experiences, praying for one another, encouraging one another - it musn't be just a formality, but real life, together. Lord, help us.

All are most welcome.


# Kaleidoscope



An alternative setting of evening worship at St Gregory's on the  $\mathbf{4}^{th}$  Sunday of each month starting at 6.30pm.


Come and join us in a relaxed service which offers a blend of traditional and modern music and songs, readings and a short talk.
