Dear Friends

I recently went to USA for a family wedding. It was tiring, since I only knew my son and his fiancée, and not the other few hundred people present; and also the President of that august nation tells me that one becomes more susceptible to jet lag as one gets a little older...

But it was a lovely time. Our daughter in law's parents are Christians, albeit from a somewhat different tradition (they're Presbyterians, attending a church which majors on expository preaching and psalm singing - both of which I appreciate, especially if done well). They were all delightful, and it made me realise afresh that, if we see our primary identity as followers of Jesus Christ, we immediately have a remarkable bond with others of like persuasion: other differences fall by the wayside. I have always found this; I have worked with Christians in countries as diverse as Liberia, Zambia, Ukraine, Russia, USA, Georgia, Armenia - it's always the same. As Paul puts it, 'For all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus'. (Galatians 3:27-8)

A last thing happened on that trip. I lost my phone. It must have been when I was getting out of a car at a hugely busy drop-off point at Chicago O'Hare Airport (we had to double park), but I didn't notice until we were queuing at check-in. I had to find it ... but could I remember where on that long concourse we had been discharged from the car? Negative. I went out, ran up and down hopelessly and dreamt of my poor old phone, squashed to a slimline version; and then prayed that wonderful prayer of desperation: 'Lord, help!' And I just had a nudge to go to a fearsome lady traffic director who was barking directions to cars – 'Ask her.' I did.

'Excuse me, I'm so sorry to bother you; but you wouldn't happen to have found a phone, would you?'

'Oh honey', she purred, 'would it be this one?' (they love an English accent).

And yes, it was, not slimline, and I did a jig of gratitude! Coincidence? Maybe. But, as William Temple, former Archbishop of Canterbury, famously said, 'When I pray, coincidences happen, and when I don't, they don't.' Sometimes it's the little things that remind us to pray through the day.
